


## Operating and Installation Instructions Wine Conditioning Unit












To prevent accidents and machine damage, read these instructions **before** installation or use.

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## IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS


This wine conditioning unit complies with all current local and national safety requirements. Inappropriate use can, however, lead to personal injury and material damage.

Read the operating and installation instructions carefully before using the wine conditioning unit. They contain important information on safety, installation, use, and maintenance. This is to protect yourself from injury, and from damaging your wine conditioning unit.

Please read and follow the instructions in the chapter on installing the wine conditioning unit, as well as the safety instructions and warnings.


Miele cannot be held liable for injury or damage caused by non-compliance with these instructions.

Keep these instructions in a safe place and pass them on to any future owner.

 Danger of injury and damage to the appliance due to the wine conditioning unit tipping over.

The wine conditioning unit is very heavy and can tip forwards when the appliance door is open.

Keep the appliance door shut until the wine conditioning unit has been built in and secured in the installation niche in accordance with the operating and installation instructions.

 Risk of injury from broken glass.

If installed at altitudes above 6,560 ft (2,000 m), there is a risk of the glass in the door breaking because of changes in air pressure. Shards of glass can cause severe injury.

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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## Appropriate use

► This wine conditioning unit is intended for use in domestic households and similar residential environments such as

- staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments
- farm houses and by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments
- bed and breakfast type environments
- catering and similar non-retail applications.

This wine conditioning is not intended for use outdoors, in damp environments or in places exposed to rain.

► The wine conditioning unit is intended for domestic use only for storing wine.

It must not be used for any other purpose.

► The wine conditioning unit is not suitable for storing and keeping cool medicines, blood plasma, laboratory preparations or other such materials or products. Incorrect use of the wine conditioning unit for such purposes can cause deterioration of the items stored. The wine conditioning unit is not suitable for use in areas where there is a risk of explosion.

Miele cannot be held liable for damage resulting from improper or incorrect use of the appliance.

► This wine conditioning unit may only be used by people (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they are supervised while using it.

The wine conditioning unit may only be used by these people without supervision if they have been shown how to use it in a safe way and recognize and understand the consequences of incorrect operation.

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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## **Safety with children**

- ▶ Children near the wine conditioning unit must be supervised. Do not let children play with the wine conditioning unit.
- ▶ The wine conditioning unit door hinges can cause injury. Keep children away at all times.
- ▶ Ensure that any packing material is disposed of safely and kept out of the reach of children. **DANGER** of suffocation!

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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## Technical safety

- ▶ The refrigerant circuit has been checked for leaks. The wine conditioning unit complies with statutory safety requirements.
- ▶ To avoid the risk of damage to the wine conditioning unit, make sure that the connection data (fuse rating, frequency and voltage) on the data plate corresponds to the household supply. Check that this is the case before connecting the wine conditioning unit. Consult a qualified electrician if in any doubt.
- ▶ The electrical safety of the wine conditioning unit can only be guaranteed when correctly grounded. It is essential that this standard safety requirement is met. If in any doubt please have the electrical installation tested by a qualified electrician.
- ▶ Reliable and safe operation of the wine conditioning unit can only be guaranteed if it is connected to the power supply.
- ▶ The electrical outlet must not be concealed behind the wine conditioning unit and must be easily accessible so that the appliance can be quickly disconnected from the electrical supply in case of an emergency.
- ▶ If the power cord supplied is damaged, it must only be replaced by an original part to prevent a hazard for the user. Miele can only guarantee the safety of the appliance when original Miele parts are used.
- ▶ The electrical outlet must be properly grounded.
- ▶ Do not connect the appliance to the electrical supply with a power bar or extension cord. These are a fire hazard and do not guarantee the required safety of the appliance.
- ▶ If moisture gets into electrical components or into the power cord, it could cause a short circuit. Therefore, do not operate the wine conditioning in areas where there may be moisture or splashing water (e.g., garages, laundry rooms).

## IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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- ▶ This wine conditioning unit must not be used in a non-stationary location (e.g. on a ship).
- ▶ In environments with a tropical climate (above approximately 90°F (32°C) and above approximately 70% humidity), the wine conditioning unit must be operated in an air-conditioned room. Otherwise, it is not possible to guarantee that the wine conditioning unit will operate without issues.
- ▶ Before installation and use check the wine conditioning unit for any visible damage. Do not operate or install a damaged appliance.
- ▶ To ensure safe operation, use the wine conditioning unit only when it has been installed.
- ▶ The wine conditioning unit must be disconnected from the power supply during installation, side-by-side heater installation, maintenance and repair work. The appliance is only disconnected from the power supply if:
  - the circuit breaker has been tripped, or
  - the power cord has been unplugged. Pull on the plug and not on the cord when removing it from the outlet.
- ▶ Installation, repair, and maintenance work should only be performed by a Miele-authorized service technician.  
Work by unqualified persons could be dangerous and may void the warranty.
- ▶ Repairs and other work performed by unauthorized persons could be dangerous and may void the warranty.
- ▶ Defective components should only be replaced by Miele original parts. Only with these parts can the manufacturer guarantee the safety of the appliance.

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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## Correct use

- ▶ The wine conditioning unit is designed for use within a specific climate class (room temperature range). Do not use in a climate class for which it is not designed. A lower room temperature will cause the compressor to switch off for longer periods, meaning that the wine conditioning unit is unable to maintain the required temperature.
- ▶ **WARNING! DANGER of overheating!** Do not cover or block the air vents. This can impair the efficiency of the appliance, increase the power consumption and cause damage to the appliance.
- ▶ If the wine conditioning unit is used for storing food which contains fat or oil, make sure that it does not come into contact with plastic components. Any spillages of oil or fat could cause stress cracks to the plastic and cause it to break or split.
- ▶ Risk of fire and explosion. Do not store explosive materials in the wine conditioning unit or any products containing propellants (e.g., spray cans). Electrical components can cause flammable mixes of gases to ignite.
- ▶ Risk of explosion. Do not operate any electrical appliances inside the wine conditioning unit. Risk of sparking and explosion.
- ▶ Use only genuine original Miele parts. If parts or accessories from other manufacturers are used, the warranty may become invalid.

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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## Cleaning and maintenance

- ▶ Do not use any oil or grease on the door seals. They can cause the seals to deteriorate over time.
- ▶ Do not use a steam cleaning appliance to clean this wine conditioning unit. The steam could reach electrical components and cause a short circuit.
- ▶ Sharp edged or pointed objects will damage the evaporator, causing irreversible damage to the wine conditioning unit. Do not use sharp edged or pointed objects to
  - remove frost and ice,
  - remove labels, stickers, etc.

## Transport

- ▶ Always transport the wine conditioning unit in an upright position and in its original transport packaging to avoid damage in transit.
- ▶ Risk of injury and damage. The wine conditioning unit is very heavy and must be transported by two people.

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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## Disposal of your old appliance

- ▶ Children could become trapped in the machine and could suffocate.
  - Remove the machine doors.
  - Leave the wooden shelves in the machine so children cannot climb inside.
- ▶ DANGER of electric shock!
  - Cut the plug off the power cord.
  - Cut the power cord off the old appliance.
- ▶ Dispose of them separately from the appliance.
- ▶ Ensure that the wine conditioning unit is not stored in the vicinity of gasoline or inflammable gases and liquids during and after disposal.
- ▶ Make sure that the coolant pipework is not damaged during disposal to avoid uncontrolled leakage of oil and coolant (see data plate for coolant type).
- ▶ Splashes of coolant can cause damage to the eyes. Be careful not to damage any part of the pipework while awaiting disposal, e.g. by
  - puncturing the coolant channels in the evaporator,
  - kinking any pipework,
  - scratching the surface coating.


### Disposal of packaging material

The packaging is designed to protect the wine conditioning unit from damage during transportation. The packaging materials used are selected from materials which are environmentally friendly for disposal and should be recycled.

Ensure that any plastic wrappings, bags, etc. are disposed of safely and kept out of the reach of children. Return the packaging to your dealer.

### Disposal of your old appliance

Electrical and electronic appliances contain valuable materials. They also contain certain substances, compounds and components which were essential for the proper functioning and safe use of the equipment. Handling these materials improperly by disposing of them in your household waste can be harmful to your health and the environment. Therefore, please do not dispose of your old appliance with regular household waste and follow local regulations on proper disposal.



Consult with local authorities, dealers or Miele in order to dispose of and recycle electrical and electronic appliances. Miele assumes no responsibility for deleting any personal data left on the appliance being disposed.

Take care not to damage the pipework at the back of your wine conditioning unit before or during transportation to an authorized, environmentally friendly collection depot.

This way, coolant in the pipework and oil in the compressor will be contained, and will not leak into the environment.

Please ensure that your old appliance does not pose a danger to children while being stored prior to disposal. See "IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS" for more information.

# Installation

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## Installation location

This appliance should be installed in a dry, well-ventilated room.

When deciding where to install your wine conditioning unit, please bear in mind that it will use more energy if installed near to a heater, a range, or another appliance that gives off heat. Direct sunlight should also be avoided. The higher the room temperature, the longer the compressor runs and the higher the energy consumption of the wine conditioning unit is.

When installing the wine conditioning unit, please note the following:

- The electrical socket must be easily accessible in an emergency and not concealed behind the appliance.
- The plug and power cord must not touch the rear of the wine conditioning unit as they could be damaged by vibrations from the appliance.
- Do not plug in other appliances behind the wine conditioning unit.

If installation near a heat source is unavoidable, observe the following minimum distances between the appliance and the heat source:

- At least 1 1/4" (3 cm) to electric or gas stoves
- At least 11 3/4" (30 cm) to oil or coal-based stoves

If it is not possible to observe these minimum distances, an isolation plate must be installed between the Wine conditioning unit and the heat source.

## Climate class

This wine conditioning unit is designed for use in climate class SN-T (room temperature range). Do not use in a climate class for which it is not designed.

Climate class	Room temperature
SN	50°F to 90°F/ +10°C to +32°C
N	60°F to 90°F/ +16°C to +32°C
ST	60°F to 100°F/ +16 to +38°C
T	60°F to 109°F/ +16 to +43°C

A lower room temperature will cause the compressor to switch off for longer periods. This can cause the internal temperature in the refrigeration appliance to rise with the risk of food deteriorating and going off.



Impaired functionality due to high humidity and high temperature. High humidity (over approx. 70%) combined with a high room temperature (over approx. 90°F/32°C) can impair the function of your wine conditioning unit.

In environments with a tropical climate, the wine conditioning unit must be operated in an air-conditioned room.



Risk of damage due to high humidity.


In environments with high humidity, condensation can build up on the external wine conditioning unit panels, which can cause corrosion.

Install the wine conditioning unit with sufficient ventilation in a dry and/or air-conditioned room.

After installation, make sure that the appliance door closes properly, the ventilation gaps are not covered, and the wine conditioning unit has been installed in accordance with these operating and installation instructions.

# Installation

## Installation notes

 Risk of damage and injury from the wine conditioning unit tipping over.

The wine conditioning unit is very heavy and can tip forwards when the appliance door is open.

Keep the appliance door shut until the wine conditioning unit has been installed and secured in its installation niche in accordance with these operating and installation instructions.

Due to its weight and size, the wine conditioning unit must be installed by two people.

## Adjoining cabinetry

The wine conditioning unit is screwed to the adjoining cabinetry to the side and above. For this reason, it is essential that all of the relevant cabinetry are secured to the ground or wall.

## Load-bearing capacity of the niche floor

To ensure the safe installation of the wine conditioning unit and to guarantee its correct functioning, the floor of the niche where the appliance is to be installed must be smooth and even.


It must be made from strong, rigid material.

Because the wine conditioning unit is extremely heavy when fully loaded, it is essential that the floor it stands on is able to bear its weight. If necessary, seek the advice of an architect or construction expert.

When fully loaded, the weight of the wine conditioning unit is approx.:

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## Ventilation

 Risk of fire and damage due to insufficient ventilation.


If the wine conditioning unit is not ventilated sufficiently, the compressor will run more frequently and for longer periods.

This causes increased energy consumption and an increased compressor operating temperature, which can result in damage to the compressor.

Please ensure that there is adequate ventilation around the wine conditioning unit.

It is essential to observe the required ventilation gaps. The ventilation gaps must never be obstructed.

## Door hinge

 Risk of damage and injury when changing the door hinges.

Changing the door hinges single-handedly can cause damage to the appliance and injury.

The wine conditioning unit is supplied with a fixed hinge. On no account should you attempt to change the door hinge yourself.

If you need to change the door hinge to the other side, please contact the Technical Service department.

## Side-by-side

This wine conditioning unit can be installed side-by-side with another wine conditioning unit or refrigeration appliance. The following overview will show you which side-by-side installation options you have with your wine conditioning unit.


Depending on the installation situation, you will need the side-by-side installation kit for side-by-side installation (see “Accessories – Optional accessories”).

Instructions for installing appliances side-by-side can be found in the side-by-side installation kit installation instructions.

# Installation

## ... with partition wall

The wall **a** between the side-by-side wine conditioning units/refrigeration appliances must be **at least 5/8" (16 mm)** thick.



If the door hinges of the appliances are next to each other, you must take into account the thickness of the cabinet fronts and door handles so that the appliance doors do not collide and become damaged if they are opened at the same time.


The wine conditioning units/refrigeration appliances are secured individually in their installation niche using the supplied installation material.

If the partition wall **a** is **narrower than 6 5/16" (160 mm)**, you will need the side panel heater from the side-by-side installation kit to prevent condensation from forming and any resulting damage.

When planning installation niches, please note that the niche into which the appliance with the side panel heater is installed must be **3/16" (4 mm)** wider (see "Installation – Installation dimensions").

If the partition wall **a** is **thicker than 6 5/16" (160 mm)**, you do not need the side-by-side installation kit, nor the side panel heater.

## ... without partition wall




If the wine conditioning unit/appliances are to be installed next to each other without a partition wall between them, they will need to be joined together with the side-by-side merging kit. In addition, you must install the heating mat to prevent condensation from forming and any resulting damage.



## Installation dimensions

### Position of the electrical connections



- The electrical connection must not be positioned higher than 9" above the floor.


The electrical socket must not be concealed behind the appliance and must be easily accessible in an emergency.


Dimensions when the appliance door is opened (opening angle 90°/115°)

# Installation

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## Installing the wine conditioning unit

### Before starting...

It is essential to read these installation instructions carefully before starting to install the wine conditioning unit.

The wine conditioning unit should be installed by a suitably qualified tradesman in accordance with these installation instructions. Safe operation of the wine conditioning unit is only assured if it has been installed and connected in accordance with the installation instructions.



**DANGER of damage and injury!**

The wine conditioning unit is very heavy and can tip forwards when the appliance door is open.

Keep the door shut until the wine conditioning unit has been built in and secured in its installation niche in accordance with the operating and installation instructions.

The wine conditioning unit is both large and heavy. Installation must be carried out by two people.

- in Canada: the Canadian Electrical Code C22.1 – latest edition/Provincial and Municipal codes and/or local codes.

The wine conditioning unit must be installed in accordance with local regulations. If local regulations are not available, the following regulations must be observed:

- in the USA: the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 – latest edition/State and Municipal codes and/or local codes.

- TX 20 screwdriver
- Hammer drill
- Drill bits in various sizes, depending on materials
- Hammer
- Open-ended wrench
- Ratchet wrench, attachment: socket, 5/16" (8 mm)
- Adhesive tape

- Level
- Tape measure
- Pencil

- Step ladder
- Hand truck

## Weight of cabinet front

Before installing the cabinet front, ensure that the weight of the door does not exceed the maximum permitted:

Wine conditioning unit	Max. weight of cabinet front
KWT 26x1 Vi(S)	160 lb (73 kg)




If the cabinet front is too heavy, this can cause damage.

Installing a cabinet front which is heavier than the maximum permitted weight could damage the hinges. This damage can affect various factors, such as operation of the appliance.

Before installing the cabinet front, ensure that the weight of the door does not exceed the maximum permitted.

# Installation

## Aligning the installation niche



The installation niche must be carefully aligned using a bubble level before installing the wine conditioning unit. The niche corners must be at 90° angles to each other, otherwise the cabinet front will not sit straight on all 4 corners of the installation niche.

## Checking the installation niche

- Check the installation dimensions (see “Installation – Installation dimensions”).
- Check the position of the electrical connection. The length of the power cord is 9' 10" (3 m).

The electrical socket must not be concealed behind the appliance and must be easily accessible in an emergency.


- Check the surroundings for possible collisions (see “Installation – Dimensions with appliance door open”).
- Only install the wine conditioning unit in stable, solid installation niches, positioned on an even and level floor.
- Also check the installation niche for the following criteria:
  - The side panels of the installation niche must be even.
  - The surrounding walls of the installation niche must be at least 5/8" (16 mm) thick.
  - The surrounding walls must be securely fixed to the floor or wall.
  - Shortened side walls must be at least 4" (100 mm) deep.

## Before installation


- Before installation, remove any accessories from the back of the appliance.
- Check the wine conditioning unit for damage during transportation.

Do not install the wine conditioning unit if it is damaged.

- Check that all parts at the back of the appliance are unhindered.
- To protect the floor during installation, secure an off-cut of flooring or similar material to the floor in front of the installation area.




- Do **not** remove the installation aids (1) from the appliance door. These will be required later for aligning the appliance in the installation niche.


 Risk of damage and injury from the wine conditioning unit tipping over.

As soon as you unscrew the brackets that fix the wine conditioning unit to the pallet, the appliance is no longer secured.

Due to its weight and size, the wine conditioning unit **must be installed by two people**.



- Unscrew the fixing brackets (2).
- With the help of several people as required, carefully lift the wine conditioning unit from the pallet, starting with the back of the appliance.

 Risk of damaging the floor from the load.

Moving the wine conditioning unit can cause damage to the floor.

Move the wine conditioning unit carefully on floors that are sensitive to scratching.

As soon as you have set the wine conditioning unit upright, you can move it using the rollers on the bottom.

# Installation

## Preparing the installation niche

⚠ Risk of damage and injury from the wine conditioning unit tipping over.

The wine conditioning unit is very heavy and can tip forwards when the appliance door is open.


The installation niche must be secured to the wall behind it and/or above it with several screws. Only this can ensure that the wine conditioning unit will not tip over after being installed in the installation niche. In addition, use the provided anti-tip brackets to secure the installation niche.

Parts required for installation are supplied with the wine conditioning unit. The plastic bags supplied are marked with letters for easy identification.

- When performing the individual assembly steps, observe the letters specified and use the matching plastic bag with the required installation equipment.

The anti-tip brackets prevent the wine conditioning unit from tipping.

The anti-tip brackets are also used to fix the installation niche securely to the surrounding walls.



- Use 2 anti-tip brackets ③ for each individual appliance or 4 anti-tip brackets for each (side-by-side) combination of 2 appliances.
- Position the anti-tip brackets ③ on the left and right of the niche.

Depending on the subsequent adjustment of the feet, the anti-tip brackets are positioned 84"-85 3/16" (2,134–2,164 mm) from the floor of the niche.



**⚠ Danger of injury and damage to the appliance due to the wine conditioning unit tipping over.**

If the anti-tip brackets are fixed too high up, they cannot be used to secure the wine conditioning unit.


The distance between the anti-tip brackets and the wine conditioning unit must not exceed 5/16" (8 mm).




Retaining screws for different uses and types of material are supplied in the accompanying pack.



- Make sure that the gap between the wine conditioning unit's rear wall and the installation niche does not exceed 2" (51 mm).
- Place a wooden wedge behind the anti-tip brackets ③ if necessary.
- While holding the anti-tip brackets in place, mark the necessary drill holes on the rear wall of the installation niche.




Securing to a concrete wall

Securing with a wooden wedge


- Secure the installation niche to the wall behind it and/or above it as required using the anti-tip brackets ③.

## Pushing the wine conditioning unit into the niche


Then push the wine conditioning unit into the niche, taking care not to damage the electrical cord.

If you are installing several appliances side by side, secure the wine conditioning units/refrigeration appliances to one another now (see the installation instructions for the side-by-side installation kit).

- To ensure that the wine conditioning unit can then be aligned correctly, the toe-kick ventilation grille must be removed from the appliance toe-kick:




- Carefully guide a flat-head screwdriver through the toe-kick ventilation grille ④ on both sides and use it to push the internal plastic latches outwards to release the toe-kick ventilation grille.
- Place the toe-kick ventilation grille to one side.



- Affix edge protection ⑤ to the adjacent cabinet fronts.
- Insert the plug connector at the back of the wine conditioning unit (see “Installation – Electrical connection”).
- Insert the plug ⑥ into the electrical socket.

The electrical socket should be close to the wine conditioning unit and easily accessible.

 Risk of damage due to electrical overload.

If the wine conditioning unit is electrically overloaded, this can cause a short circuit and therefore damage to your appliance.

When you install appliances side by side, each appliance must have its own separate electrical socket.

**Tip:** Secure the power cord to prevent it becoming caught: tie a piece of string to the middle of the power cord and as the wine conditioning unit is being pushed into the niche, pull the cord forward underneath the appliance.

- Push the wine conditioning unit carefully into the installation niche.
- If the wine conditioning unit cannot be pushed into the niche (because the floor is uneven, for example), unscrew the rear feet slightly (see “Installation – Aligning the wine conditioning unit”) and slide the appliance into the installation niche.
- Remove the edge protection ⑤ from the adjacent cabinet fronts.


# Installation

## Aligning the wine conditioning unit


The installation aids ① on the appliance door provide assistance with the alignment of the wine conditioning unit in the installation niche.

The installation aids are suitable for a cabinet front thickness of 3/4" or 1 1/2" (19 mm or 38 mm).

- Align the wine conditioning unit with adjacent cabinet fronts as described below.

Cabinet-front thickness of 1 1/2" (38 mm)


The adjustable feet at the front and back of the appliance can all be adjusted from the front of the appliance.

⚠ Risk of damage due to incorrect feet adjustment.


You may damage the adjustable feet if you use a cordless screwdriver.

Always adjust the front and rear feet by hand.




- Position the supplied spacers ⑦ on both sides on the markings next to the adjustable feet at the front of the wine conditioning unit.




- Adjust the rear feet with a ratchet (attachment: socket, 8 mm) or a TX 20 screwdriver ⑧.

# Installation



- Adjust the front feet with a ratchet (attachment: socket, 8 mm) or a TX 20 screwdriver (9).

**Tip:** Proceed carefully when adjusting the feet, alternating between the left and right feet.



- Place a bubble level across the installation aids (1) on the appliance door to check the wine conditioning unit's alignment.
- Unscrew the adjustable feet (8) and (9) on both sides at least until the marking on the toe-kick is aligned with the required 1 1/4 inch (32 mm) on the spacer (7). The standard dimension of 1 1/4 inch (32 mm) relates to a niche height of 84 inch (2,134 mm).

It is important to adjust the feet to a height of at least 1 1/4 inch (32 mm) so that the ventilation of the wine conditioning unit via the toe-kick functions correctly.


⚠ Risk of damage if the feet are adjusted too much.

The rear adjustable feet can be damaged.

Unscrew the feet **only until** the marking on the toe-kick is aligned to a maximum of  $2\frac{7}{16}$ " (62 mm) (max. niche height of  $85\frac{3}{16}$ " (2,164 mm)).

- Check the alignment of the wine conditioning unit again using the installation aids ① and the bubble level.


## Securing the wine conditioning unit in the niche



- Screw the lugs for the retaining plate ⑩ into the cabinetry above the appliance.


# Installation

If it is not possible to secure the wine conditioning unit at the top, it can be attached to the installation niche with the side retaining lugs:



- Flip open the side retaining lugs ⑪.
- Screw the side retaining lugs ⑪ to the adjacent cabinetry.

- Open the appliance door.




- Screw the retaining plate lugs ⑫ at the top and bottom to the cabinetry adjacent to the appliance.


In a side-by-side combination, only the external panels of the wine conditioning units/refrigeration appliances can be secured to the adjacent cabinetry.

## Preparing the cabinet fronts

- Open the appliance door as far as it will go.




- Unscrew the installation aids ① from the appliance door.




- Unscrew the angle trims ⑬ from both sides of the appliance door and place the trims and screws to one side – they will be required later.
- Close the appliance door.


# Installation



- Measure the gap **X** between the mounting frame and the upper edge of the adjacent cabinet front.




- Remove the nuts and washers **(14)** from the threaded bolts **(15)** and store them in a safe place – they will be required later.
- Take the mounting frame **(16)** off the appliance door by removing it upwards.



- Place the cabinet front on a firm surface, with the external side facing downwards (place on a blanket or similar to avoid it becoming scratched).
- Mark the distance **X - 1/8" (-3 mm)** on the inner side of the cabinet front.
- Similarly, locate and mark the midpoint **Y** on the cabinet front.
- Position the mounting frame **(16)** according to the markings on the cabinet front.
- Pre-drill the holes.



- Screw the mounting frame **(16)** to the cabinet front:  
Use at least one screw for each retaining point on the mounting frame **(16)**.




- Secure the mounting frame ⑯ to the top of the cabinet front, using at least 6 screws.

The mounting frame has several different types of holes to take account of a variety of cabinet fronts.

When securing the frame, always screw into the strongest part of the cabinet front. To do this, select screws which are slightly shorter than the thickness of the cabinet front.


- Screw the appliance handle to the cabinet front from the inside if necessary (not for handle-free kitchens).




- Now insert the angle trims ⑬ on both sides as far as they will go into the provided spaces in the mounting frame ⑯.


## Securing and aligning the cabinet front




- Open the appliance door and hang the cabinet front on its frame (16) onto the threaded bolts (15).




- Press the angle trims (13) into the white plastic frame on both sides and screw them on loosely at first. Spare screws are provided in the plastic bag marked with the letter E.




- Place the spacers (7) on top of the corners of the cabinet front on both sides.
- Close the appliance door and check the distance between the door and adjacent cabinet fronts.




- Align the depth of the cabinet front via the gaps in the angle trims ⑬.



- Align the height and sides of the cabinet front using the threaded bolts ⑮.
- Close the appliance door and check the distance between the door and adjacent cabinet fronts.



- Place the washers and nuts ⑭ back in position and tighten the nuts ⑭. The cabinet front is now secured.



- Now tighten the screws in the angle trims ⑬.
- Open the appliance door.
- Remove the spacers ⑦ from the cabinet front.


## Mounting the fixing brackets





The fixing bracket is used to secure the cabinet front to the bottom of the appliance door.

Do not mount the fixing brackets until the wine conditioning unit (or side-by-side combination, if applicable) has been installed and the cabinet fronts have been aligned.


- Open the appliance door as far as it will go.




- Slide the fixing bracket 17 from the outside onto the screw at the bottom of the appliance door.






- Before the cover ⑱ can be installed in the gap above the wine conditioning unit, it must be assembled as follows:



- Insert the two parts of the cover into one another.




Cover viewed from the side




- Place the assembled cover ⑱ into the gap above the wine conditioning unit so it clicks into place. While doing so, slide both parts of the cover together as required.


## Installing the cover in a side-by-side combination




- Insert the joining peg (from the side-by-side installation kit) halfway into the channel in the cover for the left-hand appliance.
- Place the second cover onto the joining peg and press the two covers together.
- Click the two covers together into the gap above the appliances.



- Install the two plastic covers ②① on both sides of the appliance door by clicking them into the gap between the appliance door and the cabinet door, starting at the bottom and working up to the top.




- Secure both sides of the wine conditioning unit using at least 3 clips ②① for the covers.




- Now attach the covers ②② onto the retaining clips ②① on both sides. In the case of side-by-side installation, the covers are only required on the outer side.




## Fitting the door trim



- Cut the door trim to the width of the cut-out in the cabinet front as required. An extra length of trim is supplied to help calculate the length required.




- Trim the long pieces of door trim for the right and left sides to the length required X.
- Fit the door trim into the gap between the cabinet front and the glass.




- Cut the short pieces of door trim for the top and bottom of the door to the length required Y.
- Fit the door trim into the gap between the cabinet front and the glass.

## Securing the toe-kick ventilation grille and toe-kick panel



- Click the toe-kick ventilation grille ④ onto the bottom of the appliance toe-kick.


 Risk of fire and damage due to insufficient ventilation.

If the wine conditioning unit is not ventilated sufficiently, the compressor will run more frequently and for longer periods.

This causes increased energy consumption and an increased compressor operating temperature, which can result in damage to the compressor.

Please ensure that there is adequate ventilation around the wine conditioning unit.

It is essential to observe the required ventilation gaps. The ventilation gaps must never be obstructed.



- If necessary, cut the toe-kick panel to the required length and height (cut along the lower edge of the toe-kick facing where it touches the floor).
- Secure the toe-kick panel to the bottom of the toe-kick ventilation grille.


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## Limiting the opening angle of the appliance door



The door hinges on the wine conditioning unit are set at the factory to enable the appliance door to be opened wide.

If, for example, the appliance door hits an adjacent wall when it is opened, you should limit the opening angle of the appliance door to 90°.



- Open the appliance door.
- Insert the pin into the lower hinge from above.

This will limit the opening angle of the appliance door to 90°.

## Electrical connection



### Risk of electric shock!

The wine conditioning unit must only be switched on when it has been installed in accordance with the installation instructions.

Ground the wine conditioning unit.

The wine conditioning unit must not be grounded via a gas pipe.

If in doubt, have a suitably qualified and experienced electrician check that the wine conditioning unit complies with relevant regulations.

Do not install a fuse into neutral current or grounding electrical circuit.

Do not use an extension cord or power bar.

Do not use a frayed or damaged power cord.



### Risk of electric shock!

For protection against electric shock, this wine conditioning unit is equipped with a pole-free plug which is protected against reverse polarity. The plug must be grounded in the usual way.

Do not remove the round grounding connector pin from the plug.

Use only a grounded plug adapter.

Wait for 1 hour after installation before plugging the wine conditioning unit into the power supply. This allows coolant and refrigerator oil to settle in accordance with regulations.

Ensure that the voltage of the power supply corresponds to the connection voltage of the wine conditioning unit. A power supply of 110–120 V, 60 Hz and 10–16 Amps, which is protected by a power switch or a fuse, is required to operate the wine conditioning unit.

The manufacturer recommends operating the wine conditioning unit on a separate circuit to avoid overloading the electrical circuit.

All relevant legal electrical, fire, and building regulations must be observed when installing the outlet and/or the wine conditioning unit.

In certain countries, wine conditioning units are required to be connected to the electrical supply via a wall-mounted ON/OFF switch.

To avoid the risk of fire, electric shock, or other injuries, the wine conditioning unit must be installed and connected by a suitably qualified electrician in accordance with all relevant local and national regulations and standards, including fire prevention.

The outlet must be easily accessible so that the wine conditioning unit can be quickly disconnected from the electrical supply in case of an emergency.

# Installation

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If the outlet is no longer accessible after installation, an additional means of disconnection must be provided for all poles. Suitable means of disconnection include switches with an all-pole contact gap of at least 3 mm. These can be circuit breakers, fuses, and relays.


The plug and power cord must not come into contact with the back of the wine conditioning unit as vibrations can cause damage to these components. This could result in a short circuit.

Do not plug in other appliances behind the wine conditioning unit.

Do not connect the wine conditioning unit to a stand-alone inverter such as those used with an autonomous energy source; for example, **solar power**. When the wine conditioning unit is switched on, power surges could result in a safety switch-off. The electronic unit could be damaged. The wine conditioning unit must not be used with what are known as **energy-saving devices** either. These reduce the amount of energy supplied to the unit, causing it to overheat.

If the power cord needs to be replaced, this must be done by a qualified technician.

## Connecting the wine conditioning unit



- Insert the plug into the back of the wine conditioning unit.

Make sure that the plug has clicked into position correctly.

- Insert the plug into the electrical outlet and switch on.

The wine conditioning unit is now connected to the electricity supply:

Follow the steps described in “Switching the appliance on and off”, section “Switching on the appliance”.



### Appliance plug

### Chalk

Use the chalk supplied to write on the magnetic strips on the wooden shelves for easy identification of the wines in storage.

## Optional accessories

A range of useful Miele accessories and care products are available for your wine conditioning unit.

### Stainless steel front panel

Stainless steel front panels give your wine conditioning unit a high-quality appearance.

Handles and toe-kick panels are also available in a stainless steel look.

### Side-by-side installation kit

To install two or more wine conditioning units/refrigeration appliances next to one another, you will need the side-by-side installation kit (see “Installation – Side-by-side”).

### Hinge pocket

If the door hinging needs to be changed on your wine conditioning unit, the upper toe-kick ventilation grille must be converted. A new hinge pocket is required in order to do this.

The door hinging must only be replaced by Miele Technical Service.

Optional accessories are available from Miele, your Miele dealer or online via the Miele website.

### Before first use

Allow the wine conditioning unit to stand for approx. 1 hour prior to connecting it to the power supply. This will help prevent any malfunctions.

### Packaging material

- Remove all packaging material from the inside of the wine conditioning unit.

Always remove all packaging material, including adhesive tape, **before** switching on the wine conditioning unit. The adhesive tape is difficult to remove from cold surfaces.


### Cleaning

Please refer to the relevant instructions in “Cleaning and care”.

- Clean the inside of the wine conditioning unit and the accessories.

### Choosing the right Door Assistant (Push2Open/Pull2Open)

The Door Assistant helps you to open the appliance door.

You can choose between the two Door Assistants Push2Open and Pull2Open (see “Selecting additional settings – Switching on the Door Assistant ”). The default Door Assistant is Push2Open.

- Select the Pull2Open Door Assistant if your wine conditioning unit has a cabinet front with a handle.
- Select the Push2Open Door Assistant if your wine conditioning unit has a handle-free cabinet front.


## Before first use

### Operating the wine conditioning unit

The touch display can be scratched by pointed or sharp objects, e.g., pens.


Only touch the display with your fingers.


If your fingers are cold, the touch display may not react.




The sensor controls underneath the temperature display can be **selected** directly by touch; the symbols and text in or above the temperature display can only be **displayed**.


### Settings mode

In Settings mode , you can select different wine conditioning unit functions and alter their settings to some extent (see “Selecting additional settings”).

- Touch the  sensor control to open Settings mode.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the function for which you wish to adjust the settings.
- Confirm your selection with *OK*.
- Adjust the settings using either the < and > sensor controls or the + and – sensor controls.
- Confirm your selection with *OK*.


The setting with the **colored** background is always the **selected** setting; it can be confirmed directly with *OK*.

- Touch the  sensor control if you wish to switch to the previous menu level or terminate the process.

Every touch of the display is confirmed with an audible keypad tone. You can switch off this keypad tone in Settings mode .

### Starting up for the first time

- Open the appliance door.





- Switch the wine conditioning unit on by pressing the On/Off switch.

The On/Off switch is located below the display.


The wine conditioning unit will start to cool and the interior lighting will come on when the appliance door is opened.

Miele will appear in the wine conditioning unit display.

- When you switch the wine conditioning unit on for the first time, you will be asked to make the following settings:

- Set the Language  
(if you accidentally select the wrong Language, return to Settings mode  and use the  symbol to change the language)
- Set the Temperature Unit:  
°C (degrees Celsius) or °F (degrees Fahrenheit)
- Set up Miele@home:

- Select Continue if you wish to set up Miele@home now (to do this, follow the instructions under “Selecting additional settings – Miele@home”).

- Select Skip if you would prefer to set up Miele@home later.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the right setting and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Touch the  sensor control if you want to return to the previous menu level.

Set-up Successful will appear on the display.

- Confirm the first use with OK.

The main screen will appear on the display (see “Appliance description – Main screen”).

You cannot terminate the initial start-up process. The only way to terminate the process is to switch off the wine conditioning unit, though the process will continue when the appliance is switched back on.


# Switching the wine conditioning unit on and off

## Switching the wine conditioning unit on

- Open the appliance door.
- Switch the wine conditioning unit on by pressing the On/Off switch.

The wine conditioning unit will start to cool and the interior lighting will come on when the appliance door is opened.

Miele will appear, followed by the main screen on the wine conditioning unit display:



## Switching the wine conditioning unit off

- Switch the wine conditioning unit off by pressing the On/Off switch.

The cooling and interior lighting are switched off.

Please note: the wine conditioning unit is not disconnected from the power supply when it is switched off with the On/Off switch.


## Switching off for longer periods of time


If the wine conditioning unit is not going to be used for a longer period of time:


- Switch the wine conditioning unit off.
- Unplug the appliance or switch off the breaker.
- Clean the wine conditioning unit.
- Leave the door to the wine conditioning unit ajar to enable air to circulate and to avoid odors building up inside it.

If, during a long absence, the wine conditioning unit is switched off but not cleaned and the door left shut, there is a risk of bacteria building up inside the appliance.

## Selecting additional settings


In Settings mode , you can select different wine conditioning unit functions and alter their settings to some extent, allowing you to adjust the appliance to suit your requirements.


Only the functions in Settings mode  that require further explanation are described below.

The door alarm and other warnings are automatically disabled when the appliance is in Settings mode .


The display is unlocked briefly so you can adjust the settings as required. Closing the door of the wine conditioning unit will reactivate the keypad lock.

### Switching Keypad Lock on or off /

Switch on Keypad Lock if you wish to protect your wine conditioning unit from unwanted temperature changes or other unintentional adjustments in settings mode .

- In settings mode , use the < and > arrow buttons to select Keypad Lock and touch OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the arrow buttons < and > to switch the keypad lock On or Off and confirm your selection with OK.
- The keypad lock will not be activated until you close the door of the wine conditioning unit.

Nothing will appear in the display to indicate that the keypad lock is switched on.



The message Press OK for 6 seconds to unlock will appear in the display if you select a sensor control while the keypad lock  is switched on.

- Follow the instructions on the display.

## Selecting additional settings

### Performing a Self Test


Perform a Self Test if you are concerned that your wine conditioning unit is not working properly and want to check if it is suffering from any problems.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the Self Test and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Touch the sensor control  if you wish to terminate the process.

The Self Test starts and the wine conditioning unit is checked for any faults or malfunctions.

- The message **System restart** appears in the display if the Self Test does not discover any faults or malfunctions.
- If the Self Test does discover any faults or malfunctions, they are indicated as error messages in the display.

An alarm will also sound.

- If you find the alarm disruptive, you can switch it off in advance by touching the  sensor control.
- Make a note of the error message(s) displayed.
- Contact Miele Technical Service and inform them of the error message(s) on the display.
- Confirm the message with OK.

System restart will appear on the display.

The wine conditioning unit briefly switches off and then back on automatically.

Self test completed will appear on the display.

- Confirm the message with OK.

The main screen appears in the display again.

### Switching on the Door Assistant

You can choose between the two Door Assistants **Push2Open** and **Pull2Open**. The default Door Assistant is **Push2Open**.

The **Push2Open** Door Assistant is suitable for cabinet fronts without handles. The door will then open automatically when you gently press against it.

The **Pull2Open** Door Assistant is suitable for cabinet fronts with handles. The appliance door can be opened easily with little force.





Risk of damage if the appliance door is closed prematurely.

When the Door Assistant is switched on, repeatedly closing the appliance door early can lead to damage or malfunctions.

Refrain from holding onto or closing the appliance door while automatic door opening is still extended. If you have indeed closed the appliance door, leave it closed for 5 minutes. Automatic door opening resets itself.



## Selecting additional settings

### Switching on Push2Open

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Door Assistant and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Mode and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Push2Open and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Touch the  sensor control to return to the previous menu level.



### – Adjusting the intensity

You can also adjust the intensity of the Push2Open function. The lower the set intensity, the less force required when you push against the appliance door.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Door Assistant and select OK to confirm your selection.
- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Intensity and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the right intensity (Low, Medium, High) and select OK to confirm your selection.



### – Adjusting the duration of the Auto-Close function

You can also adjust the duration for how long the appliance door will remain open until it closes automatically.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Door Assistant and select OK to confirm your selection.
- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select AutoClose and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the + and – sensor controls to select the duration (5 to 30 seconds) and touch OK to confirm your selection.

To protect against inadvertent opening: if you do not pull the appliance door open, it will close again by itself after a duration defined by you.

### Switching on Pull2Open



- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Door Assistant and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Mode and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Pull2Open and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Touch the  sensor control to return to the previous menu level.

## Selecting additional settings



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### – Adjusting the intensity

You can also adjust the intensity of the Pull2Open function. The lower the set intensity, the less force required when you pull the appliance door.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Door Assistant and select OK to confirm your selection.
- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Intensity and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the right intensity (Low, Medium, High) and select OK to confirm your selection.

### Switching off the Door Assistant

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Door Assistant and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Mode and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Off and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Touch the  sensor control to return to the previous menu level.

### Miele@home

Your wine conditioning unit is equipped with an integrated WiFi module.

Networking is deactivated at the factory.

To use this feature, you will need:

- A WiFi network
- The Miele@mobile app
- A Miele user account The user account can be created via the Miele@mobile app.

The Miele@mobile app will guide you as you connect your wine conditioning unit to your home WiFi network.

Once your wine conditioning unit is connected to your WiFi network you can use the app to carry out the following activities, for example:

- Call up information on the operating status of your wine conditioning unit
- Change the settings on your wine conditioning unit

Connecting your wine conditioning unit to your WiFi network will increase energy consumption, even when the wine conditioning unit is switched off.

Make sure that the signal of your WiFi network is sufficiently strong in the place where you want to set up your wine conditioning unit.

### Availability of the WiFi connection

The WiFi connection shares a frequency range with other appliances (including microwave ovens and remote control toys). This can cause sporadic or even complete connection failures. Therefore, the availability of featured functions cannot be guaranteed.

### Miele@home availability

The ability to use the Miele@mobile app depends on the availability of the Miele@home service in your country.

The Miele@home service is not available in every country.

### Miele@mobile App

The Miele@mobile App is available to download free of charge from the Apple App Store® or from the Google Play Store™.



# Selecting additional settings

## Connecting your wine conditioning unit via the Miele@mobile app

You will also require the following to log in:


- the password to your WLAN network
- the password to your appliance

Your appliance's password is its serial number, which can be found on the data plate.

You will find the data plate inside your wine conditioning.


- As soon as your wine conditioning has been integrated into your WLAN network, the message **Connection successful** appears in your appliance's display.

- Confirm the process with **OK** again.

If the WLAN connection is active,  will appear in the display.



If your serial number is “78000001” for example, your password will be “78000001”.


- In settings mode , use the < and > arrow buttons to select **Miele@home** and select **OK** to confirm your selection.

Set up will appear in the display.

- Confirm your selection with **OK**.
- Use the < and > arrow buttons to select via the App and touch **OK** to confirm your selection.
- Open the Miele@mobile app and follow the instructions in the app.

### Connecting your wine conditioning unit via WPS

Your router must be equipped with the WPS function for this connection option.


- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the Miele@home and select **OK** to confirm your selection.

Set up will appear in the display.


- Confirm your selection with **OK**.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select via WPS and select **OK** to confirm your selection.
- Now follow the instructions in the display.
- Confirm the process with **OK**.

To be able to use the Miele@home functions, you also have to register your wine conditioning unit in the app.

- As soon as your wine conditioning unit has been integrated into your home network via WPS, the message **Connection successful** will appear on the display.
- Confirm the process with **OK** again.

If the WiFi connection is active,  will appear in the display.


### Deactivating Miele@home

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the Miele@home and select **OK** to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select **Deactivate** and select **OK** to confirm your selection.

Deactivation successful will appear on the display.


- Confirm the message with **OK**.

Your wine conditioning unit is now disconnected from your WiFi network.

The  symbol will go out on the display.


### Activating Miele@home

If you have already activated Miele@home and then disconnected the connection, you will need to reactivate the connection.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Miele@home and select **OK** to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select **Activate** and select **OK** to confirm your selection.


Activation successful will appear on the display.

- Confirm the message with **OK**.





If the WLAN connection is active,  will appear on the display.

# Selecting additional settings

## Checking the WLAN connection status


- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select Miele@home and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select Connection status and select OK to confirm your selection.

Information about the WLAN connection status will then appear on the display:

-  connected: there is a strong connection
-  connected: there is an average connection
-  connected: there is a weak connection
-  disconnected

## Setting up Miele@home again

If you have changed your WiFi network, you can set up Miele@home again for your wine conditioning unit.


- In settings mode , use the < and > arrow buttons to select Miele@home and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > arrow buttons to select Set up again and touch OK to confirm your selection.

Reset configuration? appears on the display.

- Use the < and > arrow buttons to select Yes or No and touch OK to confirm your selection.


## Resetting the network configuration


Reset the wine conditioning unit's settings to the default settings when disposing of your wine conditioning unit, selling it, or putting a used wine conditioning unit into operation. This will reset the network configuration so that all personal data is deleted from the wine conditioning unit. This will also ensure that a previous owner is no longer able to access the wine conditioning unit.


- Reset the settings of the wine conditioning unit as described in the chapter "Resetting the settings to their default settings ".

### Switching off Demo Mode


Demo mode allows the wine conditioning unit to be presented in the showroom **without the cooling system being switched on**. Do not activate this setting for domestic use.

If Demo mode has been switched on as a default setting,  will show in the display.

- In settings mode , use the < and > arrow buttons to select Demo Mode and select OK to confirm your selection.

Press OK for 4 seconds to deactivate  appears in the display.

- Follow the instructions on the display and touch and hold the sensor control OK for 4 seconds.

**The countdown** Demo Mode will deactivate in seconds.  will appear in the display.

Demo Mode deactivated. The appliance will cool down.  appears in the display.

- Confirm the message with OK.

The main screen appears in the display again.


## Selecting additional settings

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### Resetting the settings to their default settings

You can reset the wine conditioning unit's settings to their default settings.

Reset the wine conditioning unit's settings to the default settings when disposing of your wine conditioning unit, selling it, or putting a used wine conditioning unit into operation. This will reset the network configuration so that all personal data is deleted from the wine conditioning unit. This will also ensure that a previous owner is no longer able to access the wine conditioning unit.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the **Factory Default** and select **OK** to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select **Reset** and select **OK** to confirm your selection.

















After a brief delay, **Settings reset** appears in the display.

- Confirm the message with **OK**.

The initial commissioning process restarts (see “Before first use – Starting up for the first time”).

## Selecting additional settings


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### Switching Sabbath Mode on or off

The wine conditioning unit offers a Sabbath Mode for the purposes of religious observance.

When Sabbath Mode is switched on, you cannot make any settings on your wine conditioning unit.

Ensure that the appliance door is properly closed, as visual and audible alarms are switched off in Sabbath Mode.


- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the Sabbath Mode and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select On or Off and select OK to confirm your selection.

When Sabbath Mode is switched on,  will appear on the display and the display brightness will be reduced (the display does not change when the appliance door is closed).

When Sabbath Mode  is switched on, the following functions are switched off:

- Door Assistant  
(for cabinet fronts without handles, the appliance door will have to be pulled from the bottom or side)
- Lighting
- All audible and visual signals,
- Temperature display
- The ambient lighting  
(if previously switched on)

You can still select:

- the sensor control for Settings mode  so that Sabbath Mode can be switched off


The Sabbath Mode function will switch itself off automatically after approx. 125 hours.

## Selecting additional settings

### Switching Ambient Lighting on or off

The Ambient Lighting can be switched on so your wines are on display even when the appliance door is closed. The interior lighting now remains on even when the appliance door is closed.

Each wine conditioning zone has its own light so that your wine conditioning unit is lit up to maximum effect.

- Touch the  sensor control on the display so that it is highlighted in color.


- Close the appliance door.

The interior lighting now remains on even when the door is closed.


- To switch the Ambient Lighting off, touch the  sensor control so that it is no longer highlighted in color.

The interior lighting is now switched off when the appliance door is closed.

### Selecting the intensity of the Ambient Lighting

You can set the intensity of the Ambient Lighting in Settings mode .

You can also choose the wine conditioning zones in which the Ambient Lighting should be switched on.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the Ambient Lighting and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the correct setting (Ambience 1 – Ambience 5):
  - Ambience 1 – Ambience 3:  
Weak to strong lighting in all wine conditioning zones
  - Ambience 4:  
Only the lighting in the wine conditioning zone in the center is switched on
  - Ambience 5:  
The lighting in the wine conditioning zone in the center is stronger than the lighting in the top and bottom wine conditioning zones.
- Confirm your selection with OK.
- Close the appliance door.

The Ambient Lighting is now set to the desired setting.

Thanks to the use of LED lighting, the wine will not be adversely affected by heat or UV light.

## Selecting additional settings

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Risk of injury from LED lighting.

This lighting corresponds to risk group RG 2. If the cover is defective, there is a risk of eye injury.

If the lighting cover is defective, do not look from a close range directly into the lighting with optical instruments (e.g., magnifying glass or similar).

### Selecting the Ambient Display

You can choose what the display should look like when the appliance door is closed.

- In Settings mode , use the < and > sensor controls to select the Ambient Display and select OK to confirm your selection.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the required display settings:
  - Temperature
  - Miele logo
  - Off (display switched off completely).
- Confirm your selection with OK.

The display settings you have selected are now active when the appliance door is closed.

As soon as you open the door, the main screen appears in the display in the usual way.

## The ideal temperature and humidity

Wine continues to mature depending on the surrounding conditions. The length of time for which wine can be kept in good condition will therefore depend not only on the temperature but also on the air quality.

The wine conditioning unit with its constant ideal temperature, increased air humidity and odor-free atmosphere offers the perfect conditions for storing your wine.

The wine conditioning unit also guarantees a vibration-free environment (in contrast to a refrigerator) so that the maturing process is not disturbed.

### Temperature

Wine can be stored at a temperature between 42° and 64°F (6° and 18°C). If you are storing white and red wines together, select a temperature between 53° and 57°F (12° and 14°C). This is suitable for both white and red wines. Red wine should be taken out of the wine conditioning unit and opened at least two hours before drinking to allow it to breathe and develop its aroma.

At too high a temperature (over 72°F / 22°C), wine matures too quickly, which prevents the aromas from developing further. Wine cannot mature fully at too low a temperature (below 41°F / 5°C).

Fluctuations in temperature put wine under stress and interrupt the maturing process. It is therefore very important to maintain a constant temperature.

Type of wine	Recommended drinking temperature
Light, fruity red wines:	57° to 61°F (14° to 16°C)
Full-bodied red wines:	64°F (18°C)
Rosé wines:	46° to 50°F (8° to 10°C)
Delicate, aromatic white wines:	46° to 54°F (8° to 12°C)
Full-bodied or sweet white wines:	46° to +57°F (12° to 14°C)
Champagne, sparkling white wines:	43° to 50°F (6° to 10°C)

**Tip:** Store the wine 1° or 2° cooler than the recommended drinking temperature as it warms up a little when poured into the glass.

**Tip:** Full-bodied reds should be opened for 2-3 hours before drinking to allow it to breathe and develop its aroma.

**Tip:** We recommend removing the oxygen from opened bottles of wine to avoid loss of aroma and taste, as well as spoiling. Special devices (a wine pump with bottle stopper, for example) create a vacuum by extracting the air.


# The ideal temperature and humidity

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## Isolator panels for thermal separation

The wine conditioning unit has two fixed isolator panels that divide the interior into three zones, which can be conditioned in different ways. This means that you can store up to three different types of wine at the same time – for example, red wine, white wine, and champagne.

## Setting the temperature

- Touch the  sensor control to set the temperature.

The previously set temperatures for the 3 wine conditioning zones are displayed.

- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the wine conditioning zone for which you want to adjust the temperature and select **OK** to confirm your selection.
- Use the + and – sensor controls to set the temperature. Keeping your finger on the sensor control changes the temperature continuously.
- Confirm the temperature setting with **OK** or wait approx. 8 seconds after the last touch of the sensor. This temperature will be automatically adopted.

**Tip:** The new temperature setting can also be confirmed and adopted by closing the appliance door.

The temperature display always shows the **required** temperature.

If you have adjusted the temperature, **wait for approx. 6 hours if the wine conditioning unit is not very full and for approx. 24 hours if the wine con-**

**ditioning unit is full** before checking the temperature display. It will take this long for an accurate reading to be given.

- If, after this time, the temperature is still too high or too low, adjust it again.

## Temperature range

In all three zones, it is possible to set temperatures between 41°F and 68°F (5°C and 20°C).

## Humidity

In most refrigerators the humidity is too low for wine and therefore a refrigerator is not suitable for wine conditioning. Higher humidity levels are necessary when storing wine to moisturize natural corks from the outside. When the humidity is too low the natural corks dry out and the bottle is no longer tightly sealed. For this reason wine bottles should always be stored horizontally to ensure that natural corks are also moisturized from the inside. If air gets into the bottle, this will have a negative impact on the wine!

**Tip:** Humidity levels can be set separately for each wine conditioning zone. Always increase the humidity level in a wine conditioning zone whenever you are using it to store wine bottles sealed with natural corks.

# The ideal temperature and humidity




Risk of damage caused by excess moisture

This will lead to condensation on the interior walls, which can cause corrosion damage.

Do **not** introduce additional moisture into the air, e.g., by placing a dish of water inside the wine conditioning unit.

## Increasing the humidity $\delta$

If you have set a higher level of humidity, the fans will switch on automatically. This will distribute the humidity and the temperature evenly around the wine conditioning unit so that you can store all your wine under the same excellent conditions. The fans switch off automatically when the appliance door is opened and remain switched off for as long as it is kept open.

- Touch the  sensor control to set the temperature.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the wine conditioning zone for which you want to increase the humidity and select *OK* to confirm your selection.
- Touch the  $\delta$  button.

The  $\delta$  button will then be highlighted in color.


- Confirm your selection with *OK* or wait approx. 8 seconds after touching the button for the last time. The setting will be automatically adopted.

The humidity increases in the selected wine conditioning zone.

# The ideal temperature and humidity

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## Not increasing the humidity $\delta$

- Touch the  sensor control to set the temperature.
- Use the < and > sensor controls to select the wine conditioning zone for which you do not want to increase the humidity and select *OK* to confirm your selection.
- Touch the  $\delta$  button.

The  $\delta$  button will then no longer be highlighted in color.

- Confirm your selection with *OK* or wait approx. 8 seconds after touching the button for the last time. The setting will be automatically adopted.

The humidity decreases in the selected wine conditioning zone.

### Door alarm

An alarm will sound if the appliance door has been left open for longer than approx. 2 minutes.

The ~~Close the door~~ message also appears on the display.

As soon as the door is closed, the alarm will stop and the message on the display will disappear.

### Turning the door alarm off early

If the alarm disturbs you, it can be turned off early.

- Touch the *OK* sensor control in the display.

The alarm stops and the message disappears from the display.

After a certain time the alarm will sound again and the message will reappear in the display until the appliance door is closed.

## Storing wine bottles

Always observe USDA food safety guidelines.

 **WARNING! Fire hazard!**


Do not operate any electrical equipment inside the wine conditioning unit. This can cause sparking.

Vibration and movement have a negative effect on the maturing process which can in turn affect the taste of the wine.


To avoid disturbing other bottles when removing a bottle of wine, store bottles of the same type beside each other on the same shelf. Avoid stacking bottles on top of one another on the wooden shelves.

Always place the bottles in a horizontal position so that the natural corks can be kept moist on the inside and air is prevented from getting into the bottles.

**Tip:** We also recommend increasing the humidity level inside the wine conditioning unit for wine bottles with natural corks (see “Increasing the humidity  $\Delta$ ” under “Optimum temperature and air quality”).

 Risk of injury from falling wine bottles.


Wine bottles may become wedged in the wooden shelves above and fall out of the wine conditioning unit when the shelves are pulled out. Always pull out the wooden shelves slowly and carefully.

 Risk of damage and injury from broken glass.

If wooden shelves and bottles protrude too far forwards, they will damage the glass door when it is closed. Please ensure that the wooden shelves and wine bottles do not protrude.

Do not cover the vents in the rear wall, as they are essential for keeping the appliance cool.

## Wooden shelves



The wooden shelves are mounted on telescopic runners which can be pulled out to make it easier to store and remove bottles.


## Moving the wooden shelves

The wooden shelves can be removed and replaced again if required.

- Pull the wooden shelf out until it stops, then lift it up and off the runners. Hold onto the frame to do this.
- To replace the shelf, click it into place on the extended rails from above. The strip must face the front.

## Adjusting the wooden shelves

The slats in the wooden shelves can be individually adjusted to suit, so that every bottle is stored in perfect safety regardless of shape or size.




- Simply lift individual slats to move or remove them from the wooden shelves. This makes it easy to adjust the wooden shelf for any size of your wine bottle.

# Storing wine bottles

## Labeling the wooden shelves

For quick and easy identification of the wines stored, you can write on the blackboard-painted surface of the strips on the wooden shelves.

You can write directly on the strip or remove it from the wooden shelf. To do so:



- Hold the strip by the sides and pull it forwards.
- The strip can be wiped clean with a damp cloth.



Risk of damage due to incorrect cleaning.

The blackboard coating on the labeling strips may be damaged.

Use clean water only to wipe the strip. **Do not use a cleaning agent.**

- Label the strip with the chalk supplied and replace it on the wooden shelf from above.

## Maximum capacity



Risk of damage due to heavy loads.

Excessive loads can damage the wooden shelves.

Do not exceed the maximum load-bearing capacity of 77 lb (35 kg) for each wooden shelf.

Do not stack bottles on the wooden shelves.

Up to 104 Bordeaux bottles (0.75 L (25.4 fl oz.)) can be stored in the wine storage unit.




**WARNING! DANGER** of injury and damage!


Do not use any mechanical or other types of aids which are not recommended by the manufacturer to accelerate the defrosting process.

The wine conditioning unit defrosts automatically.

## Cleaning and care

 **WARNING! DANGER** of electric shock!

Unplug the appliance or trip the circuit breaker.

 **WARNING! Fire hazard!**

Do not damage the coolant pipework.

Do not let water get into the electronic unit or the lighting.

Do not use a steam cleaning appliance to clean this wine conditioning unit. The steam could reach electrical components and cause a short circuit.

Do not remove the data plate located inside the wine conditioning. It contains information which is required in the event of a service call.

### Cleaning agents

To avoid damaging the surfaces of your appliance, **do not** use:

- cleaning agents containing soda, ammonia, acids, or chloride
- cleaning agents containing lime scale remover
- abrasive cleaning agents, such as scouring powder, scouring liquid, or pumice stones
- cleaning agents containing solvents
- stainless-steel cleaning agents
- dishwasher cleaner
- oven sprays
- glass cleaner (except on the glass in the appliance door)
- hard, abrasive sponges and brushes, such as pot scrubbers
- eraser sponges
- sharp metal scrapers

Cleaning and conditioning agents used inside the wine conditioning unit must be food safe.

We recommend using lukewarm water and a little liquid dish soap for cleaning.

### Before cleaning the wine conditioning unit

- Switch the wine conditioning unit off by pressing the On/Off switch.
- Unplug the appliance or switch off the breaker.
- Take any wine bottles out of the wine conditioning unit and store them in a cool place.
- Take out all other removable parts for cleaning (see “Storing wine bottles – Moving the wooden shelves”).
- Remove the labeling strips from the wooden shelves before cleaning them (see “Storing wine bottles – Labeling wooden shelves”).

### Interior, accessories, and appliance door

Clean the wine conditioning unit regularly, or at least once a month. Clean up any spills, stains, or food immediately. Do not allow them to dry and stick to the appliance.

- Clean the interior cabinet of the wine conditioning unit with a solution of lukewarm water and a little liquid dish soap. Rinse all parts by hand. Do not wash in a dishwasher.
- After cleaning, wipe with clean water and dry with a soft cloth.



Risk of damage due to incorrect cleaning.

The blackboard coating on the labeling strips may be damaged.

Use clean water only to wipe the labeling strips on the wooden shelves.


Do **not** use a cleaning agent.

- The wooden shelves should only be wiped with a well wrung-out damp cloth. They must **not** be allowed to get wet.
- Leave the wine conditioning unit open to air it sufficiently for a short while and to prevent odor build-up.
- Clean the glass panes in the appliance door with a proprietary glass cleaner.

# Cleaning and care

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## Cleaning the door seal

 Risk of damage as a result of incorrect cleaning.

If you treat the door seal with oils or grease, it can become porous.

Do not use any oils or grease on the door seal.

- The door seals should be cleaned regularly with clean water, and then wiped dry with a soft cloth.

## Cleaning the ventilation gaps

A build-up of dust will increase the energy consumption of the appliance.

- The ventilation gaps should be cleaned on a regular basis with a brush or vacuum cleaner (you could use a Miele Vacuum Cleaner dusting brush, for example).

## After cleaning


- Replace all parts in the wine conditioning unit.
- Reconnect to the electricity supply and switch the wine conditioning unit back on.
- Place the wine bottles back in the wine conditioning unit and close the appliance door.

## Frequently Asked Questions

With the help of the following guide minor faults in the performance of the machine, some of which may result from incorrect operation, can be remedied without contacting the Service Department.

This guide may help you to find the reason for the fault, and how to correct it.







To prevent cold from escaping, open the appliance doors as little as possible until the fault has been corrected.

The temperature appears in the display.</li> </ul>
	<p>The plug is not properly plugged into the electrical outlet.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Insert the plug into the outlet.</li> </ul>
	<p>The fuse has tripped. There could be a fault with the wine conditioning unit, the household electrical wiring, or another appliance.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Contact a technician or the Technical Service department.</li> </ul>
<b>The compressor is turning on more frequently and for longer periods of time; the temperature inside the wine conditioning unit is too low.</b>	<p>The temperature in the wine conditioning unit is set too low.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Correct the temperature setting.</li> </ul>

The interior lighting is not working.	The wine conditioning unit is not switched on. ■ Switch the wine conditioning unit on.
	The Sabbath Mode function is switched on: the temperature display is dark and the  symbol is shown on the display. ■ You can switch off Sabbath Mode at any time via the Settings mode  .
	There is a fault. <div> Risk of electric shock due to exposed, live electrical components. When removing the lighting cover, there is a risk of coming into contact with live electrical components. Do not remove the lighting cover. The LED lighting may only be repaired or replaced by Technical Service.</div> <div> Risk of injury from LED lighting. This lighting corresponds to risk group RG 2. If the cover is defective, there is a risk of eye injury. If the lighting cover is defective, do not look from a close range directly into the lighting with optical instruments (e.g., magnifying glass or similar).</div> ■ Contact Technical Service.

## Frequently Asked Questions

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### General problems with the wine conditioning unit

Problem	Possible cause and solution
<b>Bacteria has begun to form on the wine bottle labels.</b>	Bacteria may form on the labels, depending on the type of label adhesive used. ■ Clean the wine bottles and remove any adhesive residue.
<b>The slats on the wooden shelves are warping.</b>	Volume change due to moisture absorption or drying out is a typical characteristic of wood. An increase in humidity will cause wooden components to warp, which can lead to cracking. Knots and wavy grain are characteristic for wood and cannot be avoided.
<b>A white deposit has formed on the wine bottle corks.</b>	The corks have oxidized due to contact with the air. ■ Use a dry cloth to wipe off the deposit. The deposit will not affect the quality of the wine.

## Causes of noises

Normal noises	Cause
<b>Brrrrr...</b>	A humming noise is made by the motor (compressor). This noise can get louder for brief periods when the motor switches on.
<b>Blub, blub....</b>	A gurgling noise can be heard when the coolant circulates through the pipes.
<b>Click....</b>	Clicking sounds occur whenever the thermostat switches the motor on or off.
<b>Sssrrrrr....</b>	On multi-zone wine conditioning units you can sometimes just hear the sound of the fan inside the appliance.
<b>Crack...</b>	A cracking sound can be heard when material inside the wine conditioning unit expands.
Please bear in mind that a certain amount of noise is unavoidable (from the compressor and the coolant circulating through the system).	

Noises that you can easily eliminate	Possible cause	Solution
<b>Rattling, clinking</b>	The wine conditioning unit is uneven.	Realign the wine conditioning unit using a spirit level, by raising or lowering the screw feet underneath the appliance.
	Shelves are unstable or sticking.	Check all removable items and refit them correctly.
	Bottles or containers are touching.	Separate them.
	The transport cord clip is still hanging on the back of the appliance.	Remove the clip.
