



Concord Pacific's Renewable Energy Division Acquires Saskatchewan's Largest Wind Project, Growing Concord Green Energy's operations and advances a Canadian Renewable Energy Portfolio exceeding 1 GW

Concord Green Energy, the renewable energy division of Concord Pacific, has acquired the Golden South Wind Project, Saskatchewan's largest operating wind project by turbine count and installed capacity, significantly expanding Concord's renewable energy presence across Canada.

Terry Hui, President and CEO, Concord Pacific Group "Golden South represents an important step in growing Concord Green Energy into a larger Canadian renewable energy business. Canada is entering a period of significant investment in the power and infrastructure needed to support economic growth, and the federal government's renewed focus on green, reliable energy creates a strong environment for long-term investment. Golden South adds substantial power generation to the grid today while giving us greater scale to continue investing in the renewable energy Canada will need for the future."

Located near Assiniboia, Saskatchewan, Golden South is a utility-scale wind generation facility consisting of 50 wind turbines with 210 MW of installed generation capacity and 200 MW of contracted capacity. The project commenced commercial operations in March 2022 and operates under a long-term, 25-year power purchase agreement with SaskPower. Golden South generates the equivalent annual electricity needs of up to 100,000 homes.

"Golden South has been part of Potentia's portfolio since it began generating power in 2022, and we're proud of what the project has delivered for Saskatchewan's grid and for the communities in RM 72 and RM 73. Concord Green Energy is advancing renewable energy projects across Canada, including wind, solar, hydroelectric generation and energy storage. Its operating portfolio and projects under development represent more than 1 GW of renewable energy capacity across Canada. With Golden South, the company's operating portfolio grows to approximately 543 MW of installed renewable generation capacity, while significantly increasing the scale of its wind generation business.

The acquisition strengthens Concord Green Energy's position as a long-term Canadian owner, operator and developer of renewable energy infrastructure and provides a larger platform for continued investment as Canada expands and modernizes its electricity system.

As a major developer of master-planned communities across Canada, Concord Pacific focuses on supporting the long-term success of the cities in which it operates. The company looks forward to continuing the Golden South Wind Community Benefit Fund, ensuring seamless, ongoing support for the local programs and organizations that the Assiniboia region relies on.
